Flash is Everywhere

Portable Storage market is strong and growing

- Windows PCs 1.8 billion 20% CAGR
- Cell Phones 1.5 billion 400% CAGR
- Flash Drives 100 million 200% CAGR
- Mp3 players 35 million 250% CAGR
- Portable Hard Drives 5 million 150% CAGR



How Has Windows Failed the 2006 Consumer?

- With Windows XP, people interact with computers differently than they used to
 - Then one person, one computer, every day
 - Now -- people interact with three, four, or more machines every day
- Windows outdated mindset of One-Computer-One-Person
 - No seamless way to untether your data from one Windows machine
 - Windows Server and networking products address workplace needs
 - but only within the corporate network

The Time Has Come

- The time has come to separate hardware control layer from user management layer in consumer OS
 - Sales figures won't change if you view them on a different monitor or print them on a different printer
- Growing population of Multi-Computer users demand true data portability
 - Work with one unified set of data, no matter where you're sitting





Flash Holds the Heart and Soul

- The Killer App of Flash enable portability demanded by the growing population of Multi-Computer users
- Flash = heart, soul of the PC, containing all user information
- PC = still useful as the controller of your input/output hardware - like mice, printers and USB ports – ready, willing to accept any user's Flash Computer





Why is Flash Memory the Solution?
