

SD Host Interoperability Requirements

- SD cards need to be compatible to higher capacity type of SD hosts (SDXC/SDHC/SD), and mostly important different version of SD hosts.
- Consider your SD cards to be used on various types of SD host (microSD w/ adaptor)
- Content generated by one SD host could be consumed on another



Memory SD Hosts Interoperability Issues Study


- 1000+ SD host devices test result was studied, 120 issues are collected for analysis.
- Common Test Scenario:
 - Plug/Unplug & Enumeration
 - User behavior operation (format, I/O)
 - Power management (cold/warm boot, sleep, hibernate)
 - Performance Evaluation

Platforms With Most Interoperability Issues

 <u>Digital Camera</u> and <u>System</u> are the most prevalent SD hosts with compatibility issues, following by <u>Smartphone</u> and <u>Card Reader</u>.



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Memory Symptoms Of Interoperability Issues

Enumeration

- SD card can't be detected (w/ adaptor)
- SD card detection failure on reset and power management
- SD card capacity error

Format

- Format error (w/ adaptor)
- Take too long to quick format

I/O Error

- Stop recording at maximum resolution
- Can't take/display picture
- Data Corruption
- Can't copy file into SD card
- Hangs the host



Memory Summary for SD Quality Focus

- Validate <u>SDA SPECIFICATION</u> on Electrical, Protocol and Mechanical chapters for basic level quality.
- Always consider <u>HOW AND WHERE</u> the SD cards will be used when making the test plan. (Performance, Reliability, Interoperability)
- Ensure Host Interoperability Test coverage is good enough (i.e. <u>DEVICE VARIETIES AND TEST SCENARIOS</u>) and pay attention to high risks issues.
- PERFORMANCE USER EXPERIENCE (read/write throughput) is another key factor of Host Interoperability except functionality.
